It's hard to believe that we have already passed the midpoint of Term 4 and the end of the year is approaching with great haste. This week, we held a virtual assembly recognising the efforts and achievements of students over the past fortnight here at school. A huge congratulations go out to the students who have received class awards and book prizes for their ongoing commitment to school expectations.

# PLC Meeting

Our P&C is scheduled to meet next Monday evening, 22 November, from 6:30 - 8:00pm in the school hall. This year has been another interrupted year for our P&C with COVID preventing some meetings from taking place. This meeting will be the last planned for this school year and there may well be topics of discussion, however some important matters include:

- Casual vacancies of the P&C Executive
- Formalising P&C Executive and Account Signatories
- Year 6 end-of-year financial support (if acceptable)

Our P&C holds it's AGM late in Term 1 of the new school year. This is an inclusive step that allows new parents to become active in the P&C if they so choose. We do however need to fill current casual vacancies so that our P&C can operate successfully until the next AGM is held.

The meeting is being held face-to-face, with the requirement that all attendees are fully vaccinated and signed in via the ServiceNow School Check-In procedure. Confirmation of vaccination status will need to be shown.

## Kinder 2022 Transition Program

Our transition to school program is now two weeks in and has two more Tuesday mornings to come. It has been a delight to

see the new faces that are fast approaching the start of their school educational journeys as 2022 arrives. We look to have in the vicinity of 20 students starting off in Kindergarten next year, and we are already formulating plans and ideas to ensure a strong start for all of these children.

## 2022 Enrolments

Thank you to the families who have advised us that you will be leaving us at year's end. Whilst this is sad news, we certainly appreciate the heads up for our planning and class compositions for the new year. As a school, we are still welcoming any enrolment applications across all grades. The earlier any applications are received, the better we are able to manage and support these placements into our planned 2022 class groupings.

## Year 6 Presentation Evening

Many regular events in schools are still impacted by the current Level 3 School Operational guidelines in place until the end of this year. One area that has been relaxed is that of parent attendance at Year 6 Graduation events. This does not mean we can have any traditional Year 6 graduation, but we can work on a plan that at least enables parent participation IF fully vaccinated.

Year 6 students and families should set aside Monday 13 December as the planned date for an after-school graduation event.

Our Year 6 staff are working in cooperation with our executive staff through the following requirements to provide a graduation event for our Year 6 students.

- Ensure the school has a COVID-19 Safety Plan which outlines the guidelines specified for the event.
- Outdoor settings represent a lower risk than indoor settings. If an indoor setting is selected, the venue must be well ventilated and as large as possible for the number of attendees, notwithstanding any square metre rules.
- Ceremonies should be either conducted outside of school hours, or if conducted during school hours, must ensure that parents, visitors and the graduating

student cohort do not mix and mingle with other student cohorts on the school site

- Ensure that all attendees, including students and staff and visitors, are well and free of any flu-like symptoms and have not been directed to self-isolate by NSW Health.
- All external visitors to the school site, including parents and invited guests, must show evidence of full vaccination.
- All staff, students in Year 7 and above and visitors must wear a mask indoors, unless they have a medical exemption. Masks are strongly recommended for students in Year 6 and below. Masks are not required while drinking and eating.
- Fully vaccinated parents, carers and guests can attend, as long as the space complies with the current square metre rule within the COVID-19 Safety Plan.
- Ceremonies may need to be held in sessions if capacity guidelines cannot be met or for large student cohorts.
- Ensure people remain seated as much as possible to minimise mingling outside of nonhousehold groups or close friend groups.
- Staff and visitors attending the graduation are required to sign in using the venue's QR code check-in process. A digitised record of name and a contact number for those who are unable to check in using the QR code must be kept for a period of at least 28 days. Where possible, personal details should be collected in a way that protects it from disclosure to other attendees. Ensure records are used only for the purposes of tracing COVID-19 infections and are stored securely.
- Have strategies in place to manage gatherings that may occur immediately outside the premises, such as at entry and exit points, by staggering arrivals for larger cohorts and moving attendees into the venue upon arrival.
- Reduce crowding where possible and promote physical distancing with markers on the floor in areas where people are asked to queue, such as students waiting to come onstage to receive their certificate.
- Consider how awards and certificates are distributed or handed to the recipients in a COVID-Safe way.
- Any entertainment should be conducted in line with the COVID-19 Safety Plan and comply with equivalent public health requirements for entertainment in community venues such as restaurants

   including physical distancing from the

audience.

- Adopt and promote good hand hygiene practices and make sure that bathrooms are well stocked with hand soap and paper towels and have hand sanitisers at key points around the venue such as entry and exit points.
- Visitors should not be allowed access to areas outside of the designated event venue and should leave promptly at the conclusion of the event.

We do ask that parents be aware of and proactive in helping meet these necessary guidelines that have been put in place for such significant events to proceed.

## End of Year Assemblies

Under current guidelines, we can have outdoor/ open air assemblies to conclude the school year, however these are still parent-free. Schools can only have invited guests with specific roles (presenting awards/delivering speeches) in attendance and all of these invited guests would need to be fully vaccinated.

Staff are still determining plans in this space and will again look at options to present these assemblies virtually for parents to connect with if able to.

We are all hoping that 2022 is a year of even greater normality for us all.
